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ISF Combat Games

The ISF Combat Games is an event that includes judo, karate, taekwondo, and wrestling. The participants, both girls and boys aged 13 to 18, represent their countries in selected teams.

Within this format, the first ISF Combat Games were organised in Agra, India, in 2017. On that event, 6 countries participated with a total of 227 competitors. In 2015, Spain hosted an event which was, however, the premises of that format. That event was a piloting project from the University of Andalucía which thematic was “Fighting for Peace”.

The ISF entrusted the Hungarian School Sport Federation with the organization of the 2nd ISF Combat Games in the city of Budapest, Hungary.

Maximum number of judokas: 16

Maximum number of coaches: 4

International referee per delegation: 1 (compulsory)

Divided as follows:

Boys: Max. 1 judoka per weight category; 1 coach up to 4 judokas, 2 coaches up to 8 judokas.

Girls: Max. 1 judoka per weight category; 1 coach up to 4 judokas, 2 coaches up to 8 judokas.

Time duration rules shall follow the provisions related to the cadet category outlined in art. 1.11 of the IJF Sports and Organisation Rules.

Taekwondo

Kyorugi: Each student having color belt or any poom dan certificate can compete in one weight category.

Poomsae: One student may enter up to maximum of three events.

Maximum number of athletes: 16

Maximum number of coaches: 3

National Referee (Highly qualified and recognized by National Association) or International referee per delegation: 1-2. 1 compulsory referee per discipline in which the delegation takes part (Kyorugi and Poomsae). If a delegation is registered in both disciplines, it may register a single referee if the referee holds a license for both disciplines.

Each competitor born in 2006 (13 years old) shall own a parental and medical certificate and must conform to the UWW requirements.

Maximum number of coaches - Greco-Roman Boys: 2

After the registration phase, the ISF, in consultation with the Local Organising Committee, will have the right to decide about the organisation or not of each sport event, depending on the number of entries and/or countries.

All students must be attending schools which provide a general education.

The following are not eligible to participate:

- pupils of vocational schools who only attend that school as a complement to their vocational training;
- school teams and pupils enrolled at schools which provide sports training without any general education;
- part-time (e.g. afternoon) sports schools which take pupils from a variety of schools for training in one or more sports;
- teams formed as part of clubs, companies, universities or other institutions.

Coaches: the coach is the trainer dedicated to his/her team.

Head of Delegation: he/she may not combine the function of Head of Delegation and coach or another official function. He/she shall be the sole intermediary between his/her delegation and the Organising Committee, the ISF Technical Commission and the ISF Delegate.

Deputy Head of Delegation: he/she assists the function of Head of Delegation. Only possible from 2 sports registered or the number of participants is 45 or more.

Referees: Each delegation participating in the championship shall appoint one referee in each sport they want to take part in. All referees shall have basic and valid licence: national or international licence in taekwondo, international licence in judo, karate, wrestling.

Please notice that failure to provide one referee for each chosen sport discipline will lead to a fine of **900 EUR** per missing referee payable to the organiser prior to the competitions.

Additional adults: function must be specified: doctor, physiotherapist, interpreter, security personnel, ministry representative, journalist... etc. Any other additional person will not be considered part of the official delegation and will not be accredited by the LOC.



*Any kind of modification in the delegation composition, (including additional adult numbers), must be discussed with and accepted by the Local Organizing Committee. Any extra additional person not previously accepted by the LOC will not be considered part of the official delegation and will not be accredited.

Participants obligations:

- Each participant is required to be present throughout the whole duration of the event.
- Each participant is obliged to take part also in all of the non-sport activities.
- Each team undertakes to compete against all other participating teams.
- Each participant undertakes to compete against all other participants.
- The absence of any member of a participating team from any part of the entire sport programme, opening-, prize-giving- and closing ceremonies and socio-cultural programme may result in the team being excluded from the results.

2. Fees

a) Participation fee

In accordance with the rules laid down by ISF, the payment to be made to the organisers of the event amounts to 50 € per person and per night.

The participation fee (per person/per night) in EURO for all participants is as follows:

The fee covers full board accommodation for the duration of the event. It covers the competition, cultural programme activities and all transport in connection with the official programme (arrival, departure, sports and cultural programmes).

The country shall contact the ISF and the LOC if they plan to bring other (extra) additional adults (more than the two officials). LOC will inform the country whether the LOC will be able to provide accommodation for the extra persons or not. Please note that the service fee will differ from the abovementioned participation fee, and the LOC is not obliged to provide accommodation for them.

b) ISF levy

An additional ISF levy of 40 € per member in the delegation must be paid together with the balance of the participation fee.

c) Donation to the School Sport Foundation

The ISF School Sport Foundation intends to provide underprivileged school children with opportunities to access sports training by highly qualified PE teachers and trainers and to dispose of good quality school sport equipment and infrastructure. One of the occasions to help the Foundation is the Charity Gala Dinner in which the Heads of Delegation will be invited. An extra contribution of 50 € for taking part is requested. A second way to raise funds for the School Sport Foundation is a free contribution that you can add to the 40 € ISF levy of the participants. You can add 5 €, 10 € or 15 € per participant to the ISF levy to pay. Instead of paying 40 €, you thus pay 45 €, 50 € or 55 € per participant.

4. Insurance

Each country is required to provide insurance for each member of its delegation. At a minimum the insurance is to cover civil liability, material damage and medical costs.

6. Accreditation Procedure

Date and time of accreditation: Accreditation will occur on Sunday the 16/06/2019, on the arrival day of delegations.



Place of Accreditation: Danubius Hotel Arena****, 1148 Budapest, Ifjúság útja 1-3.

Head of Delegations are responsible for undergoing accreditation for delegation.

The Control Commission composed of representatives of the ISF Technical Delegates and representatives of the local Organizing Committee will proceed to check the following documents:

1. **Finances: proof of payment** of the balance including any bank charges and if not sent to the LOC before, the payment overview. To help the Local Organizing Committee to process your payment correctly please complete the form 'payment overview' in attachment and send it to the LOC by e-mail when you pay the balance., as well as printed to bring to the accreditation center.

2. Accreditation:

For the delegation:

- a) the School Certificate official form signed by the Headmaster of the school and the legal School Sport Entity, confirming that the athletes are full time students at the school, since the beginning of the school year.
- b) the document certifying that the delegation is covered by an insurance that at least covers civil liability, material damage and medical cost.

For every student:

- a) the passport (or identity card) bearing family name, first name, photograph, nationality and date of birth
- b) the anti-doping consent form (downloadable from ERAS)
- c) the use of image consent form (downloadable from ERAS)

Furthermore, for wrestlers:

- d) Each competitor who born in 2006 (13 years old) shall own a parental and medical certificate and must conform to the UWW requirements.

When checking is finished the Head of Delegation will receive the accreditation cards and welcome packages for each participant in his/her delegation. Participants must carry the accreditation card with them all the time to have access to transport, competition, activities and meals.

LOGISTICS

1. Arrival & Departure

Delegations must arrive on 16/06/2019 and depart on 21/06/2019 after breakfast.



The LOC provides bus transportation from all Budapest Railway Stations and Liszt Ferenc International Airport for arriving delegations. The LOC will have volunteers awaiting delegations with signs.

Delegations arriving somewhere else shall organize transportation to accommodation themselves.

Delegations arriving by car/bus are kindly asked to go directly to the hotel, where representatives from the LOC will welcome them.

If you have questions regarding organization of transportation, please contact the LOC.

Please inform the LOC if your delegation is planning longer stay than the already established by the event rules:

When the distance between Budapest and the capital of a participating country on another continent exceeds 5000 kilometres the delegation may extend its stay by arriving one day earlier or leaving one day later at the normal daily fee (50 €).

The organisation of an extended stay for the delegation (before or after the event) is a matter for the country concerned It shall not be the responsibility of the LOC.

3. Transport Network

The LOC guarantees a precise transportation system for all accredited people by buses. This transportation network will cover travel from Danubius Hotel



and Hotel Hungaria to sport venues and vice versa. Distance between Danubius Hotel Arena and sport halls are walking distance (200 m). Distance between both hotels and the sport halls is 20 minutes (1,7 km).

As food halls will be situated in the hotels, the same transportation network will assure delegation's transportation to the food halls.

4. Accommodation

Athletes will be provided with rooms of 2-3-4 beds, coaches will be accommodated in single room or double room (according to a specified request), referees will be accommodated in double rooms, Heads of Delegation will be offered single rooms, while other delegation members will be offered with single rooms or double rooms.

Please note that due to large number of referees, they may share accommodation with referees from other countries.

Laundry services will be available for a fee at the hotels. Please, note that it has limited capacity.

Parking services for cars will be available for a fee at the hotels. Please, note that it has limited capacity.

Parking services for buses will not be available at the hotels, but in the surrounding area for a fee. Delegations arriving by bus please inform the LOC in time in order to suggest proper parking possibilities.

NON-SPORT ACTIVITIES

Detailed programme can be changed depending on the number of participants. The LOC reserves the right to change programmes, updated programmes will be available on the official website of the event.

Opening Ceremony:

The Opening Ceremony will be on 17/06/2019 Monday evening. The ceremony will be held indoors, in BOK Hall. 1 participant per country will bear the flag.

Gala Dinner:

Gala Dinner will be held at 8 pm on 18/06/2019 after the sport programs, on the "Vén Hajo" Boat Restaurant.



Charity Sports Equipment Donation:

The LOC would like to invite all participating delegation to participate in a Sports equipment donation to a school focusing on children integration coming from socially disadvantaged areas. This school is lacking in sports equipment and goods, so any contribution would be grateful. We would like to organize the donation process at the Closing Ceremony, after the ISF Joy of Moving Trophy for Fair-play trophy award.

Nations' Night

The Nations Night will be at 8 pm on 19/06/2019 after the sports programs in BOK Hall.

Delegations are invited to take part in an evening named "Nations' Night" organised with the aim of encouraging exchanges between the different cultures of participating countries.

The participants are invited to introduce and to promote their countries and their culture in an original way.

Each delegation is invited to organise a stand that promotes their countries specialities in terms of art crafts, visual materials, food, drink (no alcohol), pins, leaflets etc.

In addition, each delegation may, if it wishes, introduce a facet of its country's culture on stage (with dance, songs, sketches, video, etc.) in **maximum 3 minutes**.

The music, videos should be sent via e-mail until **30/05/2019** to the LOC. It shall be brought in USB sticks and should be handed to the LOC during accreditation as well.

Cultural Day: The cultural day will be on 20/06/2019. During the Cultural Day Programme participants will have the possibility to discover the city of Budapest. Volunteers will accompany the delegations. The participants will have the possibility to see several historical, cultural places in Budapest.

Closing Ceremony:

The Closing Ceremony and farewell party will be at 8 pm on 20/06/2019 Thursday evening in BOK Hall. Programs will be held indoors. During the closing ceremony the ISF Joy of Moving Trophy for Fair-play will be awarded to one delegation; this award will be voted on by each Head of Delegation. More information on this trophy will be provided during the Head of Delegation meeting. Following these events there will be the Charity Sports Equipment Donation.



SPORTS

1. Technical Details

General Rules:

The LOC Technical Representatives for Karate and Judo and the ISF Technical Coordinators of Wrestling and Taekwondo, along with the Local Organising Committee will be responsible for the running and control of the World Schools Championship.

The World Schools Championship is organised according to ISF General Competition Rules and to current International Judo Federation, United World Wrestling, World Taekwondo and World Karate Federation rules.

The Organising Committee will nominate a Control Commission, a Disciplinary Commission and an Appeal Jury.

Event Disciplinary Commission:

In accordance with the ISF General Competition Rules, the Disciplinary Commission will be composed of

- the ISF Delegate
- A Technical Representative or Technical Coordinator
- the President of the Local Organising Committee

The Disciplinary Commission will deal with all matters relating to discipline arising during the championship matches and also during the period of the Championship where the matters are not covered by technical regulations.

Issues related to discipline that cannot be solved by the Event Disciplinary Commission on the spot will be passed on to the Permanent ISF Disciplinary Commission.

It should be noted that where there is a sufficiently serious lack of respect for ISF rules, the Disciplinary Commission can disqualify participants, teams or delegations from the competition and ask them to return home before the conclusion of the event.

Appeal Jury

In accordance with the ISF General Competition Rules, the Appeal Jury will be composed of

- A Technical Representative or Technical Coordinator
- Representative of the Local Organising Committee
- Relevant Head Referee

The Appeal Jury will decide on all appeals concerning the results of the competition in the light of the current International Judo Federation, United World Wrestling, World Taekwondo, World Karate Federation rules and the General Competition rules of the ISF. The Appeal Jury will



not pronounce on disciplinary matters. Appeal Jury decisions are final and may not be appealed.

Appeals

Appeals against results or any other appeal not concerning disciplinary matters will be heard by the Appeal Jury.

The appeal must be lodged within 30 minutes of the incident and be written in English.

The sum of 50 EUR must accompany the appeal. This sum will be refunded only if the appeal is upheld or at the discretion of the Appeal Jury. If not, the sum will be donated to the School Sport Foundation.

PSS DAEDO (GEN1) will be used at the competition. The Organizing Committee will provide DAEDO trunk protector and DAEDO E-headgear. Participating contestants are required to bring their **own groin guards, forearm guards, shin guards, mouthpieces, gloves; and GEN2, or GEN1 sensor socks** for their personal use.



5. Sport Schedule

Provisional sport schedule based on the nominations will be published on the official website.

6. Results

Results will be published on the official channels of the event. (please see Communication and media)

Results will be published at competition venues as well.

7. General Info Desk

There will be a general info desk at the hotel (8:00-20:00) where delegation may ask questions. Results will also be available at the general info desk.

MEDICAL

1. Food & Beverage

Food will be supplied by the hotels and will be served at the hotels' dining hall. Accredited persons will receive 3 meals per day: breakfast, lunch, dinner.

With so many events during the day, there will be a flexible schedule for all meals. The breakfast, lunch and dinner will be offered in buffet style every day during the event.

Tap water is drinkable. However, water will be provided for all accredited persons during meals and event venues.

The LOC will accommodate to specific diet and food restrictions, which will be specified following Phase 3 registration for participants.

2. Doping Control

Dope testing (for use of banned substances) can take place during the competition according to current ISF Anti-Doping Rules: http://isfsports.org/sites/default/files/isf-anti-doping-rules_0.pdf

If selected for testing a competitor may be accompanied by an adult. If a competitor is following a course of medical treatment which includes the use of prohibited substances according to the current WADA prohibited list

He or she must obtain from his/her National Anti-Doping Agency (NADO) a TUE (Therapeutic Use Exemption) that complies with the requirements of the International Standard and must inform the organisers immediately upon arrival.



3. Medical service

A medical service (first aid) will be available throughout the duration of the event. At the hotels medical presence will be ensured and present 24h/24h. The LOC will bear the costs of first aid during the competition.

Hungary (Hungarian: Magyarország) is a country in Central Europe. Spanning 93,030 square kilometres (35,920 sq mi) in the Carpathian Basin, it borders Slovakia to the north, Ukraine to the northeast, Austria to the northwest, Romania to the east, Serbia to the south, Croatia to the southwest, and Slovenia to the west. With about 10 million inhabitants, Hungary is a medium-sized member state of the European Union. Hungary's capital and its largest city and metropolis is Budapest. Hungary is the 11th most popular country as a tourist destination in Europe, attracting 14.3 million international tourists in 2015. It is home to the largest thermal water cave system and the second largest thermal lake in the world, the largest lake in Central Europe and the largest natural grasslands in Europe.

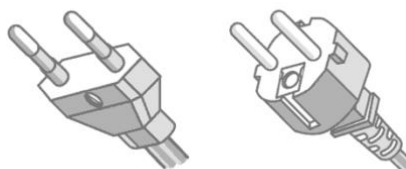
Temperature:

- Average June temperature: 20°C / 68°F

Clothing recommendations:

An umbrella and all-weather shoes are important to pack when travelling to Budapest in June. It is also recommended to have a waterproof outer layer at hand nearby for possible sudden downpours. Also consider lightweight clothing for daytime, but make sure to have a jacket or sweater for the evenings because evening weather may not hold the day's warmth.

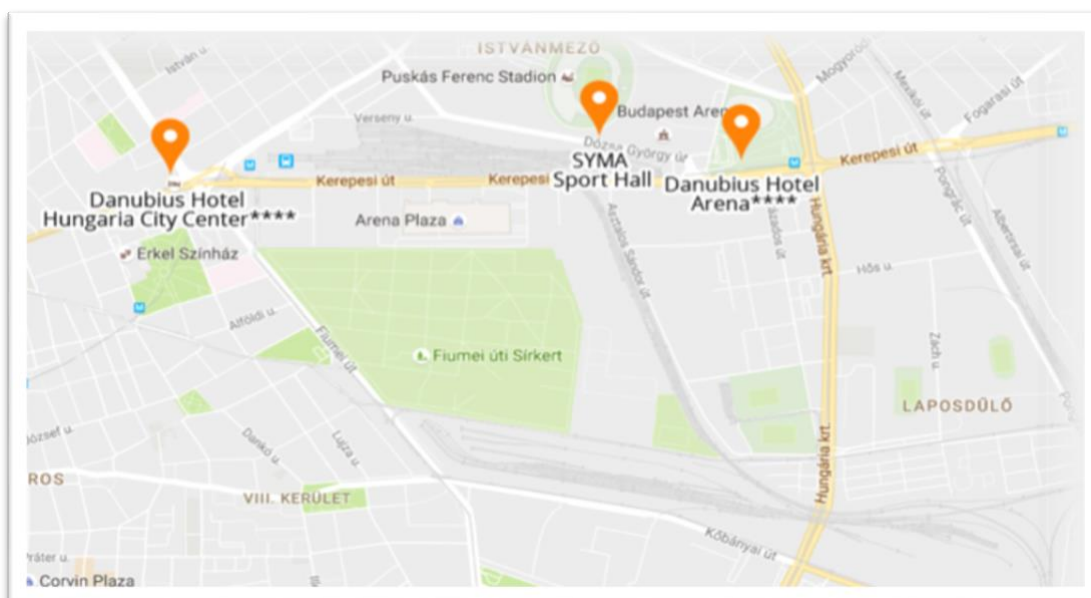
