Zlatibor is a picturesque mountain region in western Serbia, known for its natural beauty, mild climate, and vibrant tourism scene. The scenic 25-minute ride provides breathtaking views of Zlatibor's landscapes, passing over rolling hills, lush forests, and Ribničko Lake.



OBLIGATIONS

- Each participant is required to be present throughout the whole duration of the event, from the day of arrival until the day of departure, specified in the programme in the bulletin.
- Each participant is obliged to take part in all of the non-sport activities.
- Each team undertakes to compete against all other participating teams.
- Each participant undertakes to compete against all other participants.
- The absence of any member of a participating team from any part of the entire sport programme, opening, prize-giving, closing ceremonies and socio-cultural programme may result in the disqualification.

PORT OF ENTRY

Travel to the official ports of entry is to be arranged and financed by each participating delegation.

Port of entry:

- International Airport Nikola Tesla Belgrade (BEG)
- Zlatibor bus station

NOTE: The LOC will provide transportation from the airport to Zlatibor for delegations arriving by plane. Delegations traveling in their own buses are expected to go directly to Zlatibor.

► INSURANCE

Each participating delegation is required to provide insurance for each member of its delegation. At a minimum, the insurance is to cover civil liability, material damage and medical costs.



Each participating delegation is required to check whether a visa is needed to enter Serbia. Please contact the related Embassy or Consulate to consult the visa application procedure. More information you can find following next link:

TOURS AND ATTRACTIONS

GOLD GONDOLA is the longest tourist cable ride at the world with it's length of 9 kilometres. During the ride guests enjoy in stunning view of rolling mountain slopes covered with golden pine trees, after which the mountain was named.



STOPIĆA CAVE is the most visited cave in Serbia.Due to it's unique natural characteristics, length of almost 1,7 kilometres Stopica Cave was declared a natural monument by a 2005 decree of the Government of Republic Serbia.



TOURS AND ATTRACTIONS

GOSTILJE WATERFALL is one of the most attractive hydrological features of Zlatibor. The water cascades down from 22- meter- high limestone cliff, forming a unique waterfall. The area around is fully developed for tourist visits, with walking trails, football field, swimming pool and children's playground.

ADVENTURE PARK and DINO PARK The largest in the Balkans, the adventure park extends over an area of 4 ha where is a lot of content for children, but also for adults: adventure park, zip line, artificial rock climbing, children's dino village, 6D cinema, polygon for roller skating and quads for children. Within the park there is a restaurant where, along with excellent coffee and freshly squeezed juices, traditional specialties of the Zlatibor region are served.

MUSEUM "OLD VILLAGE" SIROGOJNO 26 km away from the tourist centre Zlatibor, in the village Sirogojno, there is the only open air museum in Serbia "Staro Selo". Works on construction of this museum started in 1979. On a 5 hectare location beside St. Peter and Paul's church, old log houses were brought from all parts of Zlatibor to be presented and preserved here.

Please note, that the provisional program is subject to change. Any relevant changes will be communicated in the Bulletin 2. Technical meeting on 05 April will only be for the sport competitions starting on 06 April. All other sport specific Technical Meetings will be hosted 1 day prior to the start of the respective competition.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

The only recognised method of registration is through <u>ERAS</u> - the ISF official registration platform. Within the platform there will be 2 sections of registration:

There are no limitation in the registration of additional adults, team officials and athletes.

Each delegation shall consist of:

- 1. Head of delegation mandatory
- 2. Student athlete(s) mandatory
- 3. Team officials mandatory
- 4. National authority optional
- 5. Field of Play Officials (referees/umpires/judges) optional
- 6. Additional adults optional
- 7. Delegation Media staff optional
- 8. Safeguarding officer optional

Head of the delegation

There is a mandatory amount of one (1) head of the delegation per registering delegation.

- The head of the delegation shall be the sole intermediary between the delegation and the Local Organising Committee, and the ISF.
- He/she may not combine the function with any other official role (i.e., coach, referee, etc.).

Student-athletes

- All student-athletes must be enrolled as full-time students at a school in the country/region in which they represent. All student-athletes must be attending schools that provide general education and/or vocational education incorporating segments of general education.
- Only athletes, registered on the team's list handed in at the accreditation, are authorised to take part in this competition.
- The following are *not* eligible to participate:
 - Attendees of vocational schools only attend a school as a complement to their vocational training and are not full-time students with a segment of general education.
 - Students enrolled at schools that provide sports training without any general education.



Team officials (Coaches and Other Team Officials)

Coaches

- The coach shall train/direct student-athletes in the competition.
- The presence of coaches is mandatory.

Other Team Officials

- The function of other team officials can be Doctor, trainers, Physiotherapists, Statisticians, Team managers, etc.)
- The function of each other team officials must be specified during the registration process.

National Authority

The function of each national authority must be specified during the registration process (government representative, ministry representative, etc.).

Field of play officials - FOPO (judges, referees, umpires)

Depending on the sport and on the number of athletes entered, it is requested the registering delegation provide the required number of FOPOs. Failure to provide the required number of Field of play officials (referees, judges, umpires) will lead to a fine of 900 EUR per missing FOPO.

Additional adults

The function of each additional adult must be specified during the registration process.

Safeguarding officer

The role of the safeguarding officer is to provide support to the delegation in any situation related to safety.

Delegation Media Staff

National media staff support delegations by managing media coverage, coordinating press interactions, and ensuring key messages are communicated effectively during events



To participate, each delegation is required to make two (2) payments:

1/ Deposit payment 2/ Balance fee payment

1/ Deposit payment

In order to submit and validate the registration, the delegation will need to pay a deposit of **120€ per participant.**

Please note that participation in the event is granted only by the deposit payment per registered participant.

- The sum will be deducted from the total participation cost.
- The deposit must be sent as a single payment for the whole delegation
- The deposit is non-refundable in the event of non-participation.
- All bank charges are to be met by the participants.

All deposits for the registered teams per category **are to be paid by 04.02.2025.**

If the deposits are not paid within the deadline, the registrations will not be considered valid and automatically deleted from ERAS.

► FINANCIAL CONDITIONS

2/ Balance fee payment

Balance fee payment = Participation fee - Deposit (already paid)

The balance fee payment is to be paid before the start of the event to the LOC account (LOC bank instruction will be published in Bulletin 2. All bank charges are to be met by the participating delegation).

Participation fee

The participation fee covers full board accommodation for the duration of the event plus competition, cultural program activities, and all local transport from the arrival to the official port of entry to the departure of the delegation.

The participation fee is composed of:

- 1. Rates by night: minimum 60€/night/delegation member
- 2.ISF levy:
 - 100€ per person (ISF members)
 - 150€ per person (non-ISF members)



For Serbia there are two associated plug types, types C and F. Plug type C is the plug which has two round pins and plug type F is the plug which has two round pins with two earth clips on the side. Serbia operates on a 230V supply voltage and 50Hz.



Classification

- Wheelchair 1 (WH1): Players in this class require a wheelchair to play badminton. Players in this Sport Class usually have impairment in both lower limbs and trunk function.
- Wheelchair 2 (WH2): A player in this class could have impairment in one or both lower limbs and minimal or no impairment of the trunk. Players are required to play on a wheelchair in this class.
- *Standing Lower (SL3):* In this class a player must play standing. The player could have impairment in one or both lower limbs and poor walking/running balance.
- *Standing Lower (SL4):* A second standing class where the player has a lesser impairment compared to Sport Class SL 3. The player could have impairment in one or both lower limbs and minimal impairment in walking/running balance.
- *Standing Upper (SU5):* The players in this class have impairment of the upper limbs. The impairment could be on the playing or non-playing hand.
- Short Stature (SH6): These are players who have a short stature due to a genetic condition often referred to as "dwarfism".
- All athletes, except those who have already been classified as Confirmed by the BWF, will undergo classification before starting the tournament.
- The National medical diagnostic form must be submitted to the registration system (ERAS) by March 3rd, 2024

After each online workshop, participants will receive a link to complete assessments. To validate their certificate of completion, each participant must have a minimum of 50% success rate to all the assessments before receiving the certificate.

The ISF's promotion of school sport by the ISF Academy through its international events also involves the transmission of knowledge through workshops on three themes that are dear to us all: **Safeguarding Children in Sport, Doping Prevention in Sport, Mental Health and Well-Being, Injury prevention to athletic performance and teambuilding workshops.**

ISF firmly believes that children must, through these workshops, develop the necessary inner resources to understand, identify, and react to negative behaviors such as racism, gender inequality, violence, and abuse, as well as to gain proper knowledge about doping and appropriately address mental health issues among athletes.

The challenge for ISF is to find the right way to express difficult ideas and present complicated topics to young people so that they understand, but also so that they correctly apprehend this problem and are able to react to it.

Raising awareness and enabling participants to transfer their knowledge to their peers back home are also key elements of ISF. During this event, athletes from all over the world will attend several workshop sessions given by experts in the field, passing on their knowledge and experience through dedicated, constructive, and interactive pedagogy.

Therefore, **all athletes participating in ISF events are required to attend the ISF Academy's seminars**. These seminars are scheduled to **take place during the event**, in the afternoon or evening. Specific delegation time slots will be communicated during the event briefing.

The ISF Academy collaborates with various International Federations (IFs) to provide **On-site training for local PE teachers.** Experts from each IF conduct these training sessions, which are designed to ensure the best performance and physical and emotional safety for athletes. The training is customized by sport and combines theoretical knowledge with practical application. It will take place from **April 6th to 10th, over five days.**

The goal of MASTER PE WORKSHOP program is to empower local PE teachers with advanced, sport-specific training that enhances their skills and knowledge. By collaborating with experts from various International Federations, the program ensures that teachers gain both theoretical and practical expertise tailored to each sport. This approach aims to optimize athletes' performance while prioritizing their physical and emotional safety, enabling teachers to foster a safe, supportive, and effective training environment.

FUN & SKILLS ZONE

The Fun and Skill Zone concept aims to provide the participants athletes, coaches and the local young participants with an open area where a variety of educational, physical, and cultural activities are proposed on the daily basis.
